

Adult Learner First-Time Freshman over age 25

Minimum Admissions Standards

A First-Time Freshman is a student who has *never* attended any college or other postsecondary Institution. International First-Time Freshman should refer to <u>ULM's International Admissions</u> Standards.

To be eligible for immediate admission, a first-time freshman student who is over age 25 must meet these Core Requirements:

- LA Core TU Requirements (2018-present) high school graduates, or
- LA Core 4 Requirements (2013-2017) high-school graduates, or
- LA Regents Core Requirements (2005-2012) high-school graduates), or
- Provide other evidence of potential for success:
 - a) ACT/SAT composite score taken in the last three (3) years
 - b) official GED scores
 - c) official high school transcripts, etc., and
 - Require no more than one (1) developmental course with:
 - a) minimal ACT subscore* English ≥ 18 or SAT English ≥ 500 or
 - b) minimal ACT subscore* Mathematics ≥ 19 or SAT Mathematics ≥ 510 or
 - c) Accuplacer scores in Writing (score 250) or Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, & Statistics (score 250)

This information is reviewed by committee to determine admissions decision.

* Applicants who have not taken the ACT or SAT are required to successfully complete either the English or mathematics placement test. A small fee is charged for taking the tests. Visit ulm.edu/testing for more information.

All students are encouraged to apply for admission to ULM even if they do not meet the above requirements. Such applications are reviewed on an individual basis to determine the likelihood of the applicant's success at ULM. If the student is not admitted after a review, the applicant may submit an **Appeal for Admission** form.
